Our work schedule is often impacted by changing weather conditions. *Show up on time. *Be reliable, a self-starter and able to work alone when necessary. *Be willing to ask question and receive directions. *Be able to talk about what you are noticing in the garden. *Be willing to stop what you are doing to talk with public.

Tasks include (but not limited to): tilling, planting, weeding, cultivating, irrigating, harvesting, fertilizing, pruning, trellising etc. *Conduct garden assessments and complete the provided check-in list at each garden site, report on the conditions of each garden visited on a regular basis. *Participate/Bi-weekly distribution of vegetables. *Deliver produce to the local food bank *Participate in Table sponsored community events *Engage community members who express interest in gardening or The Table ministry.
